Merlin and the Order of Druids

Merlin was a mythical figure who was the Celtic tribal archetype for prophet and seer. Druids were the primary religious group in the United Kingdom until Christianity was brought there.

I don't know about to you, but to me (and a number of other scholars) that sounds like some seriously sour weather that we're going to experience. In fact, Merlin was saying that the weather would continue getting more and more intense, which is a very, very bad sign. Remember, druids are hyper-connected with nature, and therefore the weather.

And here are a few things Merlin had to say about war and suffering:

Like many other visions, Merlin talks about a world of darkness. We know of all too many reasons that the world could be so dark. Hopefully Merlin was wrong in this area.



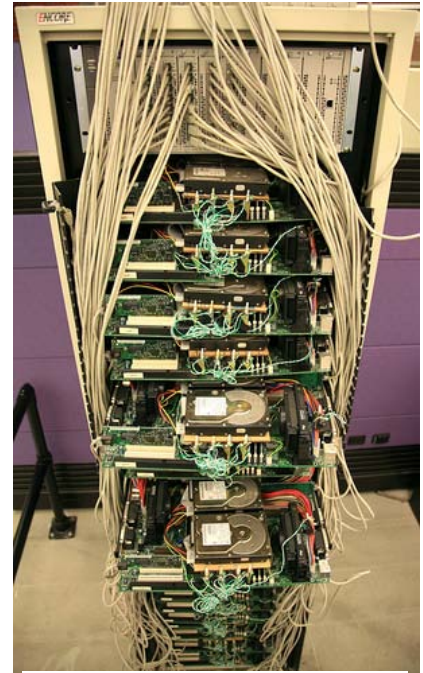
Was Merlin real? Whether he was real or not, the person who made prophecies under his name was dead on the money.

In the late 1990's the Web Bot programmers wanted a way to accurately predict stocks being traded on various world markets.

Just like a web search engine (Google, Yahoo! or Bing), the Web Bot spiders crawled the internet, searching for specific keywords. Once a keyword was found, the text immediately before and after was recorded. Then the Web Bot would analyze the text to understand what the meaning of the keyword was.



The Web Bot Project is made out of powerful computers that run day and night.

The goal of the project was to dial into the universal consciousness present in human society. It was used to try to delve deeper into what people were *really* saying, even if they were completely oblivious to their real message.

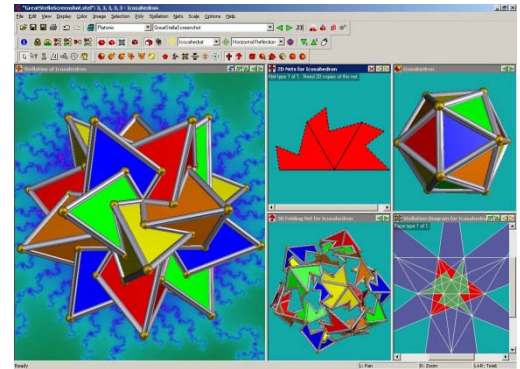
Now, you may be thinking that it's impossible to use what people are talking about to make a prediction. After all, if everyone believes something and talks about it, that should be what shows up. And, just because everyone believes it, doesn't mean it is true.

So how can you get the truth out of a lie?

After a short time in operation, the programmers started to see that the Web Bot got more right than simple stock market predictions. In fact, in June 2001, the predictions got downright deadly.

In June 2001, the Web Bot Program predicted an earth-shattering event, to take place in the next 60-90 days. Something so big, the earth would shake, and the repercussions felt for years. And this prediction was taken from the collective consciousness of all the talking going on over the internet.



The Web Bot software uses complex mathematical formulas to draw connections and analyze the text around a word.

Unfortunately, the Web Bot was right. Terrorists attacked the United States on 9/11/2001, less than 90 days after the Web Bot's prediction. The ramifications are still being felt today.

Keeping that in mind, let's take a look at another life-changing, earth-shattering prediction.

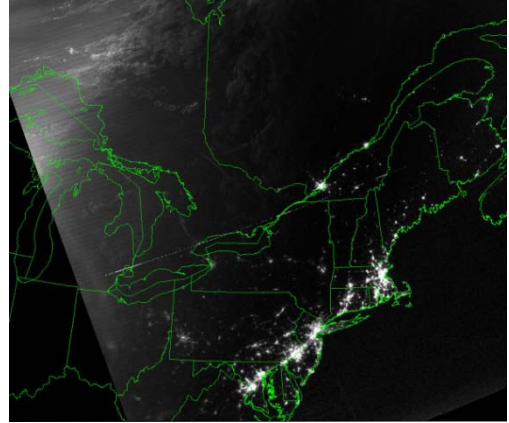
Here's a direct quote from the Web Bot Project:

- Earthquake in August 2004.
- Extreme rise of the water level (Tsunami 2004).
- Hurricane Katrina in 2007.
- Steep decline of the dollar beginning in 2007.

Definitely lends credence to Plato's idea that all humans see the major archetypal ideas through the "forms".

The Lost Book of Nostradamus

Italian writer and journalist, Enza Massa, was perusing the Italian National Library located in the heart of Rome, when she had a spectacular find. The manuscript was dated to be circa 1629 (it was then 1994). The title? Nostradamus Vatincia Code.

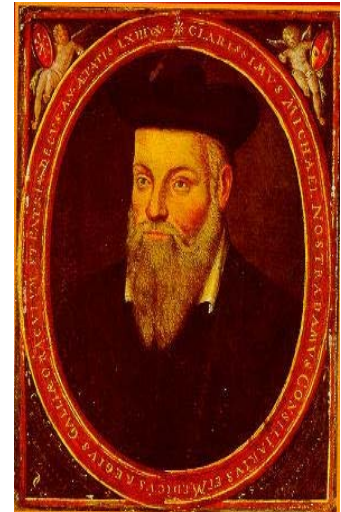
There was a name on the inside of the front cover. The name is *Michel de Notredame*, or for you who don't know the English version of that name, *Nostradamus*.

Allegedly, this manuscript was never published by Nostradamus, but rather, given to his son. His son, César de Nostredame gave it to Cardinal Maffeo Barberini who later became Pope Urban VIII.

Because of a letter from César de Nostredame to French scientist Fabri de Peiresc, the booklet was destined to be a gift to King Lois XIII in 1629.

It's unarguable that the images contain symbolic objects. Crossing banners, bugles, crosses, three writing styles which form figures, letters, animals, the list goes on in on. All of these come together in ways that seem to form certain figures much like Roman numerals, or abbreviations and common ways to write names of people.

Events such as the French revolution (the King, the Clerk and the Blade), and the female priests were predicted, even if the explicit timeline was not given. Perhaps other images of destruction have credence too.



Nostradamus being the true author of the Lost Book creates so many possibilities. These are the most important of his prophecies.

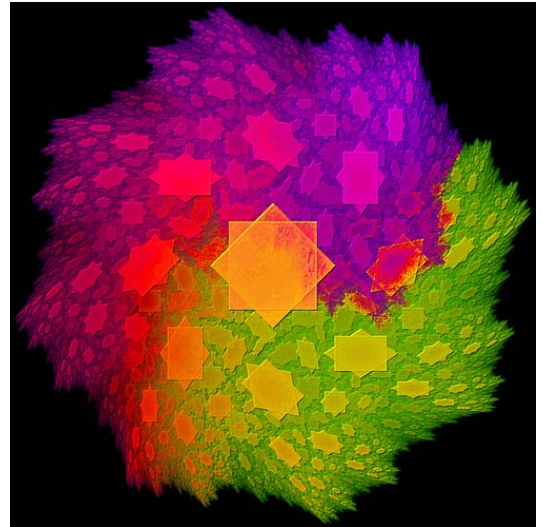
The I Ching (Time Wave Zero)

Another manifestation of the archetypal evidence humans hold inside being legitimate is found in the idea of fractal time and the I Ching.

The I Ching is the Chinese Book of Changes. It holds a system a lot like geomancy, and the West African Ifá system.

Why is change such a big deal for humans? Let's take a look at a few figures:

- 10,000 YA (years ago) humans began farming.
- 500 YA we designed the printing press.
- 50 YA we started using computers.
- 30 YA we walked on the moon.
- 25 YA we started using PCs.
- 20 YA we started using mobile devices.
- 15 YA we started connecting worldwide via the internet.
- 5 YA touchscreen devices became widely available.



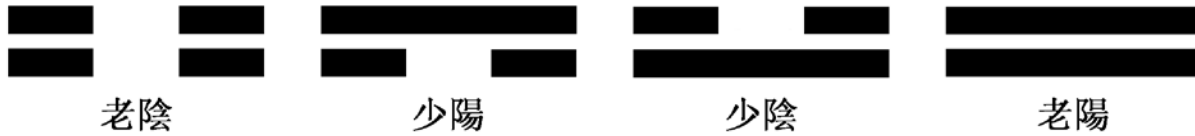
Fractal geometry is used to mathematically prove the validity of Timewave Zero. Is it chance that December 21, 2012 is a big day again?

The bottom line is, change is happening rapidly. Not just is change accelerating, the rate of acceleration is accelerating. So it's getting faster every day, and the amount it's speeding up is getting faster at the same time!

Every 18 months the power of computers double, according to Moore's Law (which has help true since his paper in 1965). Soon we will manufacturing processors using nanotechnology, and beyond that quantum tunneling and layering.

What would happen if we reach such a rate of change that all that will exist, exists instantaneously? Various scientists on the edge of their respective communities have proposed this idea of realized infinity. Two mathematicians, Terrence and Dennis McKenna believe that we will see this day, and have the date spelled out.

December 21, 2012 will be the last day in history.



The I Ching has a variety of different symbols, which often overlap for multiple meanings.

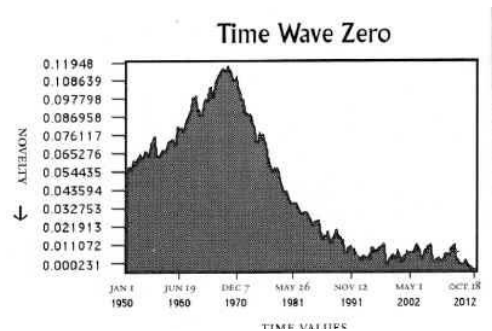
They started it all with the I Ching, because of how it is put together. There are 64 hexagrams, or six line figures that make up the entire work. Oddly enough, $6 * 64 = 384$, which is remarkably near the number of days in 13 lunar months ($29.5306 * 13 = 383.8978$).

Could it be possible that the I Ching started off as an ancient Chinese calendar? Here are a few other multiples that come up in astronomy quite frequently:

1 day x 64	x 6	= 384 days	= 13 lunar months
384 days	x 64	= 68 years, 104.25 days	= 6 minor sunspot cycles (11.2 years each)
67 years, 104.25 days	x 64	= 4306+ years	= 2 Zodiacal ages
4306 + years	x 6	= 25,836 years	= 1 precession of the equinoxes

The McKenna brothers then analyzed the possible end dates using mathematical constructs, known as fractals.

Beginning with a table using the differences of one hexagram and the subsequent one, they inferred a Mandelbrot fractal where each level is greater than the one below it by a factor of 64. Put a historic time scale on top of this bad boy, and voila! You've got history mapped out:



By graphing all of the values, McKenna arrived at Time Wave Zero occurring on December 21, 2012.

- 2012 less 67 years = 1945, WWII is going on, constitutes large-scale change.

- 2012 less 4,300 years (67×64) = 2300 BC, the beginning of history.
- 2012 minus 275,000 years (4300×64) = the emergence of Homo sapiens.
- 2012 minus 18 million years ($275,000 \times 64$) = the height of the age of mammals.
- 2012 minus 1.3 billion years = life begins on Earth.

Once again, if they had that many data points correct, what about their theories on 2012?

Well, here's what they have to say about it:

"Achievement of the zero state can be imagined to arrive in one of two forms. One is the dissolution of the cosmos in an actual cessation and unravelling of the natural laws, a literal apocalypse. The other possibility, the culmination of a human process, a process of toolmaking, which comes to completion in the perfect artefact: the monadic self, exteriorised, condensed, and visible in three dimensions; in alchemical terms, the dream of a union of spirit and matter"

Now, if this was something new that came about after, say 1995 or 2000, picking the end date of December 21, 2012 would be all too convenient.

But this came out in the 1970s.

Twenty years before the Mayan prophecy regarding 2012 became a mainstream phenomena. They picked it, simply because it fit the data.

Another coincidence?

The Hopi

The Hopi are an ancient Native American tribe that was centered in Arizona. A group of people known for their magnificent towns built into the side of mountains, known as *mesas*.

The name “Hopi” is actually shorthand for “Hopi’sinom” which is the name the Hopi use for themselves. In English that means roughly the “People Who Live in the Correct Way”. It also is thought to come from the word “Hopita” which translates to “peaceful ones”.

The Hopi life is supposed to revolve around the idea of being peaceful, and living life as the “gods” intended it.



Hopi respect tradition, and have always respected tradition, which helps for the prophecies to be passed down unchanged.

Keep all of that in mind as we take a closer look at the Hopi prophecy and December 21, 2012.

White Feather was one of the greatest prophets of the Hopi people. He traveled far and wide, following the paths set down by his ancestors.

According to him, he saw and learned much wisdom during his travels, especially at the “holy altars of stone” built by “his brothers”.

But, at the time when White Feather knew he was dying, there was no one left to carry the torch of wisdom forward. His people had forsaken the old ways in favor of new, strange ways. But, oddly enough, this had all been foretold.

The lost White Brother, who would journey to the Hopi from the stars was on his way, and White Feather knew it. In fact, he knew that the end of the Fourth World was rapidly approaching because of nine signs.

1. **The First Sign:** *The coming of white men, similar to Pahana, but not living the way. Men who will take land that isn't theirs.* – The Europeans coming to the Americas.

2. **The Second Sign:** *Spinning wheels filled with voices will move across the prairies.* – Settlers moving out West.

3. **The Third Sign:** *An animal similar to a buffalo, but with long, curved horns, will dominate the land.* – Enter the cattle of settlers.



"Snakes of Iron" could very well mean trains in the United States, and everywhere else.

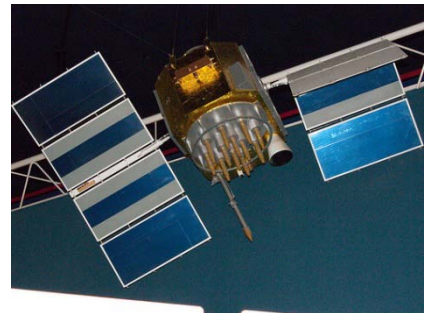
4. **The Fourth Sign:** *Snakes made of iron will cross the land.* – Trains, and railways in the U.S.

5. **The Fifth Sign:** *All land will be woven in a great spider's web.* – Telephone and telegraph lines.

6. **The Sixth Sign:** *The land shall be crisscrossed with rivers of stone that make pictures of the sun.* – Asphalt and concrete roads that spread across the continent.

7. **The Seventh Sign:** *You will hear of the sea turning black, and many living things dying because of it.* – The BP oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico is the most recent example of this.

8. **The Eighth Sign:** *You will see many youth, who wear their hair long like my people, come and join the tribal nations, to learn their ways of wisdom.* - Tourism on the Indian reservations.



Satellites have crashed many times, but in the recent past, one of the International Space Stations was allowed to decay and crash from orbit. Good bye human dwelling in the stars.

9. **The Ninth Sign:** *You will hear of a dwelling-place in the heavens, above the earth, that shall fall with a great crash. It will appear as a blue star. Very soon after this, the ceremonies of my people will cease.* – the space station Mir, which was continually inhabited, was allowed to crash in 2001.

Quite obviously, the Hopi prophecy has been correct so far. All the signs have been fulfilled. If White Feather is right, the shift from the Fourth Age, to the Fifth Age is coming, and coming fast.

Ragnarök

Ancient Norse civilization was relatively straight-forward. They lived to fight, drink, marry and raise a family.

To get an inside look at what the Norse believe will happen during Ragnarök, you've got to understand what the word means.

Without getting into an Ancient Norse language lesson, "ragnarök" is a compound word. The first half, *ragna* means roughly "gods" or more literally "ruling powers", and comes from the Proto-Germanic word "rageno". *Rök* makes up the second half, and has a whole slew of meanings, such as "development, origin, cause, relation, fate, and end".

Here's the tricky part: for the Vikings, ragnarök uses a few of the words for "rök". The three biggest ones to remember are "development, origin, end". It seems like a paradox to have both the beginning, development, and end, but we'll get more into that later.

Ragnarök fits the way Vikings lived their lives perfectly. A classic good-versus-evil prophecy, the Vikings hold that the gods are going to wage a war to end all wars, and unfortunately, are going to lose, no matter what.

They believe that their civilization began with only fire, and ice (not a huge surprise for people from a frosty climate), and will go back to fire and ice as the earth is recreated.

Sure, the Norse culture is all about legends, and stories. Sure, most of them are unlikely. After all, giant wolves, sea serpents, and trolls are not real, but every other civilization, the Vikings were trying to explain things they saw in dreams and visions with common cultural themes.

Much like the Mayan beliefs, Ancient Norse seers talk about a collision between worlds, which, as you can imagine, means bad news.



Vikings were extremely deadly in battle

Every star in the sky will fall from the heavens, and the Earth will be shadowed in a state of constant night. Our water will be poisoned and the land will slip into the sea's hungry maw. And, since all the light is gone, a frozen winter will hold Earth in a tight, icy grip.

The Norse understand that this prediction means death for every single human (and god) on Earth. Since a death on the battlefield is the best way to get to Vahalla (Heaven) the Norsemen hold on to the great war as a means of salvation.

Norse mythology holds a strong common idea with Christianity as well. The bare-breasted, heavenly women-fighters that go by the name "Valkyries",

are the go-betweens that escort fallen warriors from the battlefield to Valhalla.



Thor was their chief deity, who as can be expected was extremely war like.

These Valkyries come into play right before the apocalypse. The last sign of the times in Norse culture is the great strife between the immoral evildoers of the world, and the good.

Another area of overlap in Norse mythology and many common cultures is Thor's hammer. In the end of days it looks very similar to the swastika. Also, his chariot is pulled by goats, which is an extremely common symbol for the end of days. All these themes are echoed by the tombs of fallen Norsemen.

The Vikings received many visions and things they took as signs. However, the reason they received them was because they ate large amounts of a naturally occurring form of LSD. Since they had such a powerful high from consuming the mushrooms the Norsemen were convinced that they were receiving communications from the beyond, and turned into Berserkers in battle. The bloodlust, and battle madness made the Vikings seem indestructible to their enemies, and enabled them to perform great feats of strength.

When we look at the entire Norse method of soothsaying, it seems that they had a method a lot like the Mayans. It is interesting that there is such an overlap between two civilizations that were completely separated.



Vikings ate mushrooms before battle that contained a natural form of LSD. Such a strong hallucinogen gave them many visions during battle.

Signs of the Times

I'm hesitant to bring quotes from the Holy Bible into this. Quotes out of context can mean nothing, or something completely different than what it sounds like to us. To get the inside scoop you should check official Catholic Church teachings, but here are a few of the signs of the times, directly out of the Bible.

1. False prophets would raise up for love of money, and have many followers. (2 Peter 2:1-3) See some at: Fakemessiah.com

2. Our sexuality would be twisted until we were rampantly homosexual (2 Timothy 3:3) – occurrences of homosexuality, or at least people being open about it have been increasing over the past twenty years, not decreasing.

3. Earthquakes happening all over the world, in different kinds of places (Matthew 24:7) – the earth has been shaking radically, from the Tsunami in 2004 (caused by an underwater earthquake) to the Haitian Earthquake in 2010.

4. We would not know life without stress (2 Timothy 3:1) – antidepressants, spa weekends, and increased drug usage show that we are completely beset by stress, all through our life.

5. Countless wars would scar the planet (Matthew 24:6) – I take this one with a grain of salt, because many wars have occurred all throughout history, but not with so many nations involved.

6. Our people would ignore the Law of Moses in favor of adultery, murder, and worship of idols (Matthew 24:12) – there have been no new sins since Sodom and Gomorrah, but the frequency and lack of sorrow for our sins have definitely increased.

7. We would chill our religion to the bones, by forsaking our one true God. (2 Timothy 3:5) – read like atheism to anyone? We have taken the passion out of our love for God, even deep in the Church.

8. **Men prefer cheap fantasies over wholesome Christian truth.** (*2 Timothy 4:4*) – we substitute pornographic material for healthy relationships, and twist existing relationships.

9. **Death by unfathomably deadly disease** (*Matthew 24:7*). – the number of deaths attributed to AIDS worldwide is almost too high to count. There are over 160,000 American deaths from AIDS every year. And we've got no idea how to cure it.

10. **Marriage would be denied and seen as empty.** (*1 Timothy 4:3*) – again, divorce rates have skyrocketed in the US and Europe. The rate they are increasing continues to climb.

11. **Rightful owner of Jerusalem would be a cause of international unrest** (*Zechariah 12:3*) – the conflict revolving around the Gaza Strip and all of Israel is apparent.

12. **Humanity would become materialistic** (*2 Timothy 3:4*)

13. **There would be many involved in travel** (*Daniel 12:4*) - the world is open to anyone with a plane ticket and a passport today, whereas in the times of Jesus a journey to Egypt from Palestine was considered an enormous undertaking.

14: **And there shall be signs in the sun, and in the moon, and in the stars; and upon the earth distress of nations, with perplexity; the sea and the waves roaring; Men's hearts failing them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth: for the powers of heaven shall be shaken.** (*Luke 21:25-26*).

15: **Youth would become rebellious. For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy** (*2 Timothy 3:2*)

The Fate of the United States

The United States of America was founded on a number of different principles. From Masonic to Christian to Deist to Atheist the views were anywhere from radical to the norm.
